



Code of Conduct

- All players must stand by the rules of the game. Cricket is a gentlemen's sport and no one is bigger than the game.
- Players and team members must treat opposition players and fellow team players with dignity and respect any given time, including during and outside of matches.
- BDSCC always encourages constructive feedbacks. However, players must refrain from making defamatory or libellous comments towards the team management.
- Any physical or verbal abuse, or any form of toxicity toward team members or opposition players will not be tolerated.
- All players must follow the direction respective captain and vice-captain.
- All players must **stick** to the selection decisions undertaken by the Team Selection Committee with regards to player and match placements. If your circumstances change that may affect these decisions, please get in touch with BDSCC Secretary or Vice President. Formal email to the clubs email address is preferred with at least 3 days' notice.
- All players must give at least five match availabilities among friendly and social cricket matches. BW Cricket Team Selection Committee will prioritise player preference, although preferred placement cannot be guaranteed due to many variables.
- If a player's preferred placement date has been granted, they must be present on the day of the match. Failure to attend the match without an alternative arrangement made with Team Management will still count as a match played in terms of BDSCC's commitment to play each registered players in at least 5 matches. Although out of courtesy and respect, BDSCC will do its best to place said player in an alternative match if possible.
- Players need to wear BDSCC's official jersey/outfit during an official match.
- Alcohol consumption is prohibited prior to and during the game. Alcohol must not be visible or present at any match grounds/venue, especially near our team's tent/stands.
- As an individual you may play for any other team or tournament as you wish, however you are not permitted to use Bangla Warriors Canberra name and any of its associated resources. You may even play for another team in the same tournament Bangla Warriors are participating as long as you don't play any match against Bangla Warriors.
- Bangla Warriors Canberra and Bangladesh Sports Club Canberra is not liable for any type of injury or property damage during Practise session, Friendly matches and Sunday social tournaments, however ACT Sunday Social Cricket Association has their own insurance that may cover few things according to their policy. Please refer to their terms and conditions for further information in this regards.
- All notice, complaints, queries, feedbacks and suggestions must be communicated via Email to BDSCC's email address below. Any other forms of communication will be disregarded for all intents and purpose. This is for quality and assurance purposes by ensuring proper archiving and logs of all communication within the team. This is to protect both the player and BDSCC and its associates.



- In social media groups operated by BDSCC, participants must not comment in a way that may be construed as harming their own reputation or the reputation of another participant, BDSCC members, sponsors, key stakeholders or programs.

Penalties and consequences applicable for breaching the codes outlined above may include any or all of the following:

1. Suspension from some or all remaining social and friendly matches.
2. Exclusion from all future sporting and cultural programs organised by BDSCC.
